MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP COVER LETTER**

Active long time members of the Wathena Community, Mr. and Mrs. Hayes set up a perpetual investment in their will from which income is to be used by the school districts in of Wathena and Troy to assist worthy students in education at the academic level following completion of their high school studies. The amount of the scholarship each year will be determined by the amount of interest generated by the investment fund.

**Who may apply:** This scholarship is available to students who graduate from Troy High School and have attained at least a 2.5 accumulative grade point average. This scholarship is available to seniors planning to further their education by attending a two-year, 4-year college, or Vocational Technical College.

**How recipients will be selected:** A committee made up of Troy High School Teachers, and Counselor will review the applications and select the award winners. The committee reserves the right to withhold one or all awards in any given year if, in the opinion of the committee, appropriate applications have not been received. The scholarships will be given out during the awards program in the spring of each year.

**How students may apply:**

1. Obtain application information and forms from the Troy High School Counselor. The counselor may establish the date when materials are due.
2. Fill in the attached personal data sheet.

**Amount and number of Scholarship(s):** Up to two (2) \$500 scholarships will be awarded to deserving students who graduate in the spring of 2010. Each year, the amount and number of scholarships offered will be determined by the interest attained by the account.

**How to receive the scholarship stipend:** Once selected by the scholarship committee, the student will have to show proof of enrollment to the school district office. A check will be cut and sent to the college or vocational technical college the student is attending.

**Deadline for applications:** The deadline for applications is April 15<sup>th</sup> of each year in the high school Counselor's Office.
