#### WELCOME TO THE 2019-2020 SCHOOL YEAR Pat McKernan, SUPERINTENDENT AND TGS PRINCIPAL

I would like to welcome you all back for a new school year! I am excited to start my fourth year as your Superintendent of Schools and Troy Grade School Elementary Principal. Over the last three years, it has been my pleasure to get to know your children and see their growth in many areas. Many times in our life we take great comfort in things staying the same. However, there are other times when change needs to happen to continue to make progress. I see the USD 429 district in a transition time where we will continue to talk about "doing things differently". Academic areas we will be focusing on this year, will be the curriculum, instruction, and assessments. We need to make improvements on our Kansas Assessment scores this coming year. I believe we should score at the state average or higher on any state or national assessment we take. That needs to be the minimum. I also believe with some coordination and effort, we can do better than the state average on these assessments. USD 429 is also continuing to look at revising and expanding the current curriculum. As a staff, we will spend time this year deciding what to teach and test and discuss the best strategies to help students reach their academic goals.

As a district, we also need to focus on school attendance. The state of Kansas considers chronic absenteeism as 10% of the school days in session. At the end of the year, this could be sixteen days of absence. Not only is that chronic, but in my opinion, excessive. There are many families and students who do a great job. 59% of our students district wide missed five or less days of school. On the other side of this 11% of our students miss sixteen days or more and are considered chronically absent. We can do better. At the upper elementary grade and middle school and high school grade levels, students may be required to stay after school to make up assignments or if they are chronically absent. We also want this time to be productive time so we want to put supports in place for extra help or homework completion.

We again, had some turnover in key teaching positions. Please read about the new staff we have hired. I am very confident we have hired great replacements for those staff that left. Please get to know these new staff members. I think you will be impressed also.

Facilities Upgrades – USD 429 converted to all LED lighting last spring. You will see new LED lighting in the gymnasiums and classrooms. The lighting is not as noticeable in the classrooms but very noticeable in the gymnasiums. We should also see a difference in our utility bills this year. We are also in the process of having the exterior of the cafeteria/weight room/music room painted, along with the bus bar and crow's nests. We will be replacing the stadium bleacher boards to aluminum boards to finish that project that was started many years ago. We have moved the counselor's office up a floor across from the high school office. This should allow for better communication between students and the counselor and the teaching staff and the counseling department.

Whether it be the gym, ballpark, library, church or other community activities, it is always great to see the students during the summer. I look forward to another new year and see what accomplishments your children will reach. See you in August.

## From the Desk of Mr. Estes, 7-12 Principal/Activities Director:

Greetings and Salutations from the office of the Principal at Troy Middle/ High School. As I set at my desk writing this, I can hear many people working in the halls getting things ready for a new year.

Some changes you will notice in the building include a new counselor's office, a new technology office, and a fresh coat of paint in many locations. There have also been changes to our security system. Though they will mostly be unseen by most of us, we have added several cameras and access card readers.

Besides these physical changes, we will be welcoming some new teachers to the building. These include Mrs. Birdsong in the business department, Ms. Clary in the music department, Mrs. Cluck in the science department, and Mr. Fallaha in the English department.

I hope everyone reading this has been able to maintain a commitment to being a responsible productive citizen. As a step in helping every student be the best possible student, we are going to focus on reducing chronic absenteeism. The Kansas Department of Education defines chronic absenteeism as missing 10% or more of the possible days. If a student misses more than once every other week, that student is chronically absent. According to our handbook, students who miss more than 4 days in any semester should be staying after school to make up the work. As my commitment to reducing the number of chronically absent students, I will be strictly enforcing the handbook rule.

As most of the students can tell you, I have been counting down the days until August 29<sup>th</sup> since about May 17<sup>th</sup>. This year, Thursday, August 29<sup>th</sup>, is the happiest day of the year! That is the day we all get to come back to school. As I write this letter, it is only 50 days away, I can hardly wait!

Enjoy the rest of your summer and strive to be the most responsible productive citizen you can!

# **STUDENT ACCIDENT INSURANCE**

Due to necessary budget reductions, USD 429 does not purchase secondary student accident insurance. This type of insurance is voluntary for school districts to buy.

This insurance was available for school time and school activity student accidents. It mainly served as a secondary insurance covering limited expenses not paid for by a family's primary insurance. It was never intended to cover all accident costs at school. Students and families with health insurance should now check those policies to make sure you understand what is covered and not covered. For those without health insurance a voluntary limited accident insurance will be available at enrollment at parent cost. Please take this information and study it closely even if you have insurance.

Students involved in athletics and activities should also make sure they feel they have adequate coverage for potential injuries and accidents. The district is required to carry a \$25,000 catastrophic policy by the Kansas State High School Activities Association. This policy takes over after \$25,000 in expenses have been incurred that are not covered by a primary policy.

Also, the district pays for a similar policy for all students during the school day that begins at the \$25,000 deductible level and will pay for various accidents and losses.

USD 429 employees take every precaution to make sure students are safe and secure at school and at activities. However, accidents do happen. **USD 429 assumes no financial responsibility for student accidents and injuries that occur at school or at activities.** These costs are the responsibility of the parents as part of **school attendance.**

## NURSE'S NOTES

#### IMMUNIZATIONS?

The protection of your child against preventable diseases is an important part of maintaining their health and preparing them for school. The State of Kansas mandates certain immunizations to be completed BEFORE a student may enter school for the first time, as well as boosters to be completed at other times. Last spring letters to parents were mailed informing you if your child was due for a tetanus and/or MMR booster. . . these boosters need to be COMPLETED BEFORE the first day of school. Students entering Kindergarten for the first time this year also need to have their immunizations COMPLETED before the first day of school. The following is a list of required immunizations:



**Hepatitis A**: two doses required for children less than 5 years of age in early childhood programs.

Pneumococcal Conjugate (PCV): four doses required for children less than 5 years of age in early childhood programs. Total doses needed dependent on the age of the child when doses given.

**VARICELLA (CHICKEN POX):** 2 doses <u>required</u> for grades K-2 and 7th. 1 dose required for grades 3-6 and 8-11 unless history of varicella disease documented by a licensed physician. Or laboratory evidence of varicella immunity. Two doses are currently recommended by the ACIP for all ages.

**Haemophilus Influenza Type B (HIB):** three doses required for children less than 5 years of age in early childhood programs. Total doses needed for series completion is dependent on the type of vaccine and the age of the child when doses given.

#### (revised May 2011)

**Medications:** Forms will be available at registration for students who will need to take medications at school. Written permission from parent/guardian should accompany **ALL** medication. Written permission from the doctor/dentist should accompany all prescription medication. ALL MEDICICATION MUST BE SENT IN ITS ORIGINAL CONTAINER. FYI: when requested Pharmacists will label two bottles of prescription medication-one for home and one for school. If your child carries an inhaler, written permission from your physician is required to be able to carry it in school.

**Head Lice:** NOW is the time for YOU to begin checking your child's head for lice and/or their nits. As always, head checks will be done at school the first few days we are back, but the potential spread of head lice can be prevented by parents who check their children regularly. Please remember ANYONE can get head lice. they do not discriminate. <u>NO student with live head lice or knits will be allowed to stay at school. Students have to be treated with head lice shampoo or medication prior to returning back to school and be lice and knit free. The school nurse or secretary will check students returning to clear for school entry and for several weeks thereafter.</u>

**Students with health condition/food allergies:** Parents need to talk to the school nurse to set up health care plan with nurse and teacher to help appropriately care for your child, enrollment is a good time for this process. Paperwork will also be given out and will be needed to be reviewed over by your child's physician.

If you have any questions or concerns please feel free to contact the school nurse.

### **ASBESTOS NOTIFICATION LETTER**

Dear Parents and Staff:

Asbestos is an issue we have been dealing with for many years. The Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act of 1986 (referred to as AHERA), was enacted to determine the extent of and develop solutions for any problems schools may have with asbestos.

Asbestos has been used as a building material for many years. It is a naturally occurring mineral that is mined primarily in Canada, South Africa, and the U.S.S.R.

Asbestos properties made it an ideal building material for insulating, sound absorption, decorative plasters, fireproofing, and a variety of miscellaneous uses. There have been over 3,000 different products made using asbestos materials. EPA began action to limit uses of asbestos products in 1973 and most uses of asbestos products such as building materials were banned in 1978.

As required by AHERA a certified asbestos inspector and management planner inspected all facilities at Troy, locating, sampling, and rating the condition and hazard potential of materials in the district facilities suspected of containing asbestos. An asbestos management plan for Troy facilities was developed from the inspection and laboratory analyses records. Recently, the facilities were reinspected to see that all aspects of the management plan are being carried out.

This notification letter, education and training of our employees, and a set of plans and procedures designed to minimize the disturbance of the ACM, and plans for regular surveillance of the ACM are a part of our efforts to meet government regulations (AHERA).

A Copy of the asbestos management plan is available for your inspection in the district administrative offices during regular office hours. Inquiries regarding the plan should be directed to: Pat McKernan, Troy USD 429, Box 190, Troy, Kansas 66087; phone (785) 985-3950.

It is the district's intent to comply with federal, state, and local regulations in this area. Whatever steps are necessary to ensure your children and our employees have a healthy and safe environment in which to learn and work will be taken.

## **Unified School District No. 429**

#### **Mission Statement**

## **Kindergarten:**

A student must be five years of age on or before August 31, 2019 to enroll in kindergarten. Birth certificate and immunization records as required by the State are necessary for enrollment. Vaccinations are required for school entry.

## **First Grade:**

A student must be six years of age on or before August 31, 2019 to enroll in first grade (unless the child has completed kindergarten in a public school in another state). Birth certificate and immunization records as required by the State are necessary at enrollment.

## **PROOF OF IDENTITY REQUIRED**

#### KSA 72-54106

Whenever a child enrolls in school for the first time, the district is required to secure proof of identity of the child. Proof of identity can be a birth certificate, a court order placing a child in the custody of SRS, a certified transcript or other similar public record. If proof of identity is not provided within 30 days, the district must notify the local law enforcement authorities that are responsible to investigate the identity of the child.

The assistance of parents and guardians in providing the required documentation is greatly appreciated.

## **Physical Examinations Required**

Before any student in grades 7-12 practices or participates in any extra-curricular athletics (including cheerleading), the student must have a KSHSAA physical examination form on file with their school. This examination must have been given after May 1, 2019 in order to be valid for this school year. The appropriate physical forms are available on the schools web page www.troyusd.org. and also available at the District Office. This requirement is a part of our compliance with Kansas State High School Activities Association.
